

Agritourism in Monroe County, TN

Monroe County doesn't just have great dining, we also have several places for you to get a closer look at the agriculture that makes your meals possible. Come visit these farms, vineyards, and shops to see how the crops are grown while living with the land. If you are looking for markets, check out our [Farmers Markets](#) page.

[Tsali Notch Vineyard](#) grow six varieties of the indigenous wild grapes called muscadines. They sell wines, juices, and jellies made from muscadines. The vineyard is open to the public with tours and a visit to their tasting room. They are also an event venue perfect for weddings and parties!

[Benton's Smoky Mountain Country Hams](#) preserves the traditional way of making dry cured ham and bacon. Their store is open to the public but they do not offer tours.

[Grain Bin Commodities](#) sells baked goods just like your grandparents made them. Their bakery has cookies, cakes, and other sweet treats with many of the ingredients coming from their own farm.
